

Philadelphia Works Welcomes Kevin B. Mahoney to its Board of Directors

Philadelphia Works, the designated Workforce Development Board (WDB) for the City of Philadelphia, has a Board of Directors that serves as an advisory, planning, and policy board under the guidelines of the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). In addition, the Board of Directors serves as the governing body of the 501(c)(3).

The membership of the Board is composed of business, education, labor, community, and government leaders. Members are appointed by the Mayor of the City of Philadelphia, and membership is guided by WIOA. The Board Chair must be a business representative, and the Board must have a majority of business/private sector members. This ensures that the business community is the leading voice in our local workforce system.



Chief Executive Officer of the

Kevin B. Mahoney is Chief Executive Officer of the University of Pennsylvania Health System, a pillar of the Penn Medicine enterprise. He leads health system operations spanning seven hospitals, 13 multispecialty centers, and hundreds of outpatient facilities in Pennsylvania, Delaware, and New Jersey.

Penn Medicine consists of the University of Pennsylvania Health System and the Perelman School of Medicine. Together, they form one of the world's leading and America's oldest academic medical centers dedicated to the related missions of medical education, biomedical research, and excellence in patient care.

Mahoney joined Penn Medicine in 1996 and held leadership posts for nearly three decades. Before his appointment as CEO in July 2019, he served as Executive Vice President and Chief Administrative

Officer of the University of Pennsylvania Health System and as Executive Vice Dean of the Perelman School of Medicine. At Penn Medicine, he has led initiatives focused on improving patient experience and care efficiency, including the creation of the Clifton Center for Medical Breakthroughs and the unification of the health system under one shared electronic health records platform.

An advocate for access and innovation, Mahoney co-launched a partnership with the Wharton School to invest in organizations strengthening the social determinants of health, contributing \$1.6 million to early-stage businesses through the Fund for Health. He has been named one of the "100 Most Influential People in Health Care" by Modern Healthcare and one of the "Most Admired CEOs" by the Philadelphia Business Journal. He holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Millersville State College and an MBA and doctorate from the Fox School of Business at Temple University.
